Object relations theory is that branch of psychodynamic thought that focuses on relationships being more crucial to personality development than are individual drives and abilities (see Greenberg and Mitchell 1983). Here, the important identity-preceding structure is the self, a personality structure formed out of interpersonal interactions.
